1. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 선택한 조각상 디자인을 고르시오.

M: Hi, Ms. Taylor. How's the statue design for City Library going?

W: Oh, I was about to show you these sample sketches, Mr. Johnson.

M: Let me see. Hmm... I like the statues with two children.

W: Really? I thought the design with one child was better.

M: But having only one child looks kind of lonely.
